

Convicted of a Crime

Bradshaw is subject to disciplinary action pursuant to ORS 744.074(1)(f) because of the following circumstances. On 8/30/99, Bradshaw was convicted by a guilty plea by the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for the County of Washington, in the criminal case entitled *State of Oregon v. Tabitha Amber Bradshaw*, case number D9904554M, of one count of the crime of theft in the second degree, a misdemeanor, pursuant to ORS 164.045. Bradshaw committed the crime by stealing about \$279 in passes and currency from the Scoggins Valley Park at Hagg Lake in Washington County, Oregon from about 8/8/99 to 8/15/99.

Engaged in Dishonest Conduct

Bradshaw is subject to disciplinary action pursuant to ORS 744.074(1)(h) by engaging in the following conduct. From on or about 6/15/00 to 9/18/01, Bradshaw was employed by Tom Quirk (Quirk), an insurance agent in Portland, Oregon. On an unknown date, Bradshaw obtained from Quirk's records about a particular client, a checking, debit card, or credit card, account number of the client. From on or about 9/13/01 to on or about 10/8/01, without the knowledge of either Quirk or the client, Bradshaw used the client's account number to (1) by telephone, pay two monthly installment payments on Bradshaw's automobile loan for the amount of \$400, (2) by the internet, purchase a secured credit card for the amount of \$1,000, (3) by telephone, buy groceries for the amount of \$200, (4) by the internet, purchase another secured credit card in the about of \$300, and (5) by telephone, pay for several nights lodging at a Ramada Inn motel near Aloha, Oregon for an unknown amount, for a total of at least \$1,900. During this same period, Bradshaw unsuccessfully attempted to use the account number to purchase, by the internet, goods at G.I. Joes, and Old Navy retail stores.

Order

Pursuant to ORS 744.074(1), Bradshaw shall not be issued any license authorized by ORS Chapter 744 at any time hereafter.

Notice of Judicial Review

Pursuant to ORS 183.480 and 183.482, Bradshaw may request the Oregon Court of Appeals to review this order by filing a written petition for judicial review with the court within 60 calendar days after the date this order was sent to Bradshaw.
