

Convicted of Crime

Crawford is subject to enforcement action pursuant to ORS 744.013(2)(e) because of the following circumstances. On 1/14/03, Crawford was convicted, based on a plea of guilty, by the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Jackson County, in the criminal case entitled State v. Suzanne D. Crawford, number 030162FE, of (1) one count of the crime of racketeering, a felony, pursuant to ORS 166.620(3), and (2) of three counts of the crime of theft in the first degree, also a felony, pursuant to ORS 164.055. Crawford committed the crimes by stealing or otherwise illegally obtaining a total of \$1,621,729.10 from the self-insured workers' compensation and general liability funds of 12 city and county municipalities and private businesses in Oregon and California during the period from 1/1/01 to 9/25/01. The date of the crime, the name and state of the victim, and the amount stolen relative to each victim is as follows:

Crawford is subject to enforcement action pursuant to ORS 744.013(2)(o) by stealing or otherwise illegally obtaining a total of \$1,621,729.10 from 12 city and county municipalities and private businesses in Oregon and California during the period from 1/1/01 to 9/25/01.

Order

Pursuant to ORS 744.013(1) and 744.011(1), Crawford’s expired Oregon adjuster license is revoked on the date of this Final Order.

Notice of Right to Judicial Review

The party has the right to appeal the order to the Oregon Court of Appeals pursuant to ORS 183.480 and 183.482. If a party wants to appeal the order, the party must file a petition for judicial review with the Court of Appeals within 60 days from the date this order was served on the party. If the order was personally delivered to a party, then the date of service is the day the party received the order. If the order was mailed to a party, then the date of service is the day the order was mailed to the party, not the day the party received the order. If a party does not file a petition for judicial review within the 60-day time period, then the party will lose the right to appeal this order. If a party appeals the order, the party should also send a copy of the petition to the Insurance Division by delivering it to the Labor and Industries Building, 350 Winter Street NE, Room 440 (4th Floor), Salem, Oregon; or mailing it to PO Box 14480, Salem, OR 97309-0405, or faxing it to 503-378-4351; or e-mailing it to mitchel.d.curzon@state.or.us.
