The Director of the Oregon Department of Consumer and Business Services (director) commenced this administrative proceeding, pursuant to Oregon Revised Statutes (ORS) 731.256, to terminate enforcement action previously taken against Don M. Lucas (Lucas).

The director makes the following final decision in this proceeding.

**Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law**

Licensing Information

Lucas has been licensed in Oregon as a resident individual insurance producer from 11/21/08 to 4/5/10. Lucas' license was indefinitely suspended on 4/5/10. Lucas' license has not expired or been surrendered since 4/5/10. Lucas' last recorded residence and business address is located in Springfield, Oregon.

No Longer In Arrears in Child Support Obligation

On 4/5/10, the director issued an order, case number INS 10-03-009, indefinitely suspending Lucas' Oregon resident individual insurance producer license pursuant to ORS 744.074(1) and ORS 25.780(1), from 4/5/10 until (1) the director receives from the Oregon Department of Justice a written notice pursuant to ORS 25.774 that the director may reinstate or renew the suspended license or issue a new license, and (2) Lucas otherwise qualifies for a license.

On 10/7/10, the director received from the Oregon Department of Justice a written notice pursuant to ORS 25.774 that the director may reinstate or renew the suspended license or issue a new license. The director does not have any reason to believe that Lucas does not otherwise qualify for a license.

## **Order**

Pursuant to ORS 25.774, Lucas' Oregon resident individual insurance producer license is no longer suspended from the date of this order.

### **Notice of Right to Judicial Review**

A party has the right to judicial review of this order pursuant to ORS 183.480 and ORS 183.482. A party may request judicial review by sending a petition for judicial review to the Oregon Court of Appeals. The court must receive the petition within 60 days from the date this order was served on the party. If the order was personally delivered to a party, then the date of service is the date the party received the order. If the order was mailed to a party, then the date of service is the date the order was mailed to the party, not the date the party received the order.
