The Director of the Oregon Department of Consumer and Business Services (director), by and through the Insurance Division, commenced this administrative proceeding, pursuant to Oregon Revised Statutes (ORS) 731.256, to terminate previous enforcement action taken against David E. Williams (Williams).

The director makes the following final decision in this proceeding.

**Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law**

Licensing Information

Williams has been licensed in Oregon as a resident individual insurance adjuster from 12/14/99 to 7/31/09 and since 9/2/09. Williams' license has been suspended since 12/6/12 pursuant to ORS 25.780(1). Williams' license is scheduled to expire on 7/31/13. Williams' license number is 616384, and NAIC national producer number is 6235440. ## License No Longer Subject to Suspension Pursuant to ORS 25.750 to 25.783

Williams is no longer subject to enforcement action pursuant to ORS 25.774 because of the following circumstances. ORS 25.780(1) requires an “entity that issues licenses, certificates, permits or registrations that a person is required by state law to possess to engaged in an occupation, [or] profession ...to suspend without further hearing the license, certificate, permit or registration of a person upon certification by the administrator [as defined in ORS 25.010(1)] that the person is subject to an order suspending the license, certificate, permit or registration. The certification must include the information specified in ORS 25.750(1).” On 12/3/12, the director received from the Oregon Department of Justice a notice to suspend dated 11/29/12 certifying that Williams is subject to an order suspending Williams’ Oregon resident individual insurance producer license pursuant to ORS 25.780(1). The certification included the information specified in ORS 25.750(1). On 12/6/12, the director issued an order, case number INS 12-12-001, suspending Williams’ license pursuant to ORS 25.780(1). ORS 25.774 states in part that “[w]hen, at any time after suspension under ORS 25.750 to 25.783, the conditions resulting in the suspension no longer exist, the administrator [as defined in ORS 25.010(1)] shall so notify the issuing entity and shall confirm that the license, certificate, permit or registration may be reinstated contingent upon the requirements of the issuing entity. On 1/28/13, the director received from the Oregon Department of Justice a notice to reinstate dated 1/24/13 pursuant to ORS 25.774 informing the director that the director may reinstate Williams’ license “because the reasons for suspension no longer exist.”

### **Order**

Pursuant to ORS 25.774, Williams’ Oregon resident individual insurance adjuster license is no longer suspended effective the date of this order.

### **Notice of Right to Judicial Review**

A party has the right to judicial review of this order pursuant to ORS 183.480 and ORS 183.482. A party may request judicial review by sending a petition for judicial review to the Oregon Court of Appeals. The court must receive the petition

within 60 days from the date this order was served on the party. If the order was personally delivered to a party, then the date of service is the date the party received the order. If the order was mailed to a party, then the date of service is the date the order was mailed to the party, not the date the party received the order.
