On September 22, 2015, the Director of the Oregon Department of Consumer and Business Services (“Director”), by and through the Insurance Division, properly served notice (“Notice”) on Steve Parks (“Parks”) that the Director intended to issue an order revoking Parks’ Oregon nonresident insurance producer license (“License”) pursuant to ORS 744.074 for having failed to timely report to the Director administrative action taken against Parks in another jurisdiction.

The Notice offered Parks an opportunity for a hearing if requested within 21 days of service of the Notice. The Notice further informed Parks that if a hearing was not conducted because Parks did not timely request a hearing or otherwise defaulted, then the designated portion of the Director’s file and all materials submitted by Parks in this case would automatically become part of the contested case record for the purpose of proving a *prima facie* case.

The Director did not receive from Parks a request for a hearing and did not conduct a hearing.

The Director finds that the record of this proceeding proves a *prima facie* case.

NOW THEREFORE, after considering the relevant portions of the Director’s file relating to this matter, the Director enters the following Order:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Parks was licensed in Oregon as a nonresident individual insurance producer from March 2013 to June 2015. His License has been expired since June 30, 2015. Parks’ NAIC national producer number is 10404561.

2. Parks was the subject of an administrative action in New York for conducting insurance business without a license. The action concluded on October 24, 2013 with revocation of Parks' New York producer license.

3. Parks was the subject of an administrative action in Louisiana for failing to report the New York action. The action concluded with a \$250 fine on January 21, 2014 and revocation of Parks' Louisiana producer license on May 4, 2014.

4. Parks was the subject of an administrative action in Ohio for failing to report the New York and Louisiana actions. The action concluded on June 24, 2014 with a civil penalty of \$400 and administrative cost of \$100.

5. Parks did not report any of the abovementioned administrative actions to the Director within 30 days after the date of the final disposition of each respective matter.

#### ULTIMATE FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Parks has been subject to administrative actions in New York, Louisiana, and Ohio.

2. Parks' producer licenses have been revoked in New York and Louisiana.

3. Parks did not report any of the abovementioned administrative actions to the Director within 30 days after the date of the final disposition of each respective matter.

#### CONCLUSION OF LAW

1. Pursuant to ORS 744.011, the expiration of Parks' License did not deprive the Director of jurisdiction to proceed with action or disciplinary proceedings against Parks.

2. Parks violated ORS 744.089(1), an insurance law, by failing to report an administrative action taken against Parks in another jurisdiction to the Director not later than the 30<sup>th</sup> day after the date of the final disposition of the matter. Under ORS 744.074(1)(b), the Director may revoke Parks' License for violating an insurance law.

3. Pursuant to ORS 744.074(1)(i), the Director may revoke Parks' License because New York and Louisiana have revoked Parks' producer licenses.

#### ORDER

Pursuant to ORS 744.074(1), Parks' nonresident individual insurance producer license is revoked on the date of this order.

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO JUDICIAL APPEAL

You are entitled to judicial review of this order in accordance with ORS 183.482. You may request judicial review by filing a petition with the Court of Appeals in Salem, Oregon, within 60 days from the date this order is served.
