### C. PROGRESS OF SECTION 1332 WAIVER - General

12. Provide an update on progress made in implementing and/or operating the approved 1332 waiver. During the third quarter of 2022 the Oregon Reinsurance Program (ORP) has completed processing the healthcare claims for the six eligible health insurance carriers on the individual market. Next, the enrollment for the individual market are still showing strong numbers. Further, a legislative concept is being drafted to help members of the Covid-19 Public Health Emergency Medicaid Redetermination which may begin to unwind during the first quarter of 2023.

#### **Enrollment Report**

The enrollment for individual ACA compliant enrollment ending September 30, 2022 for both on- and off-market totals approximately 167,406 members.

### 2021 Reimbursement Analysis

ORP has processed all healthcare claims for the 2021 program year. The grand total for all six eligible insurers amounted to \$224,310,360.84 (attachment point of \$83,000 with a cap of \$1 million). The budgeted coinsurance was for the 2021 program year was 50 percent, which brought the total to \$112,155,180.42. The budget set for the 2021 program year totaled \$107,800,000.00. This overage triggered the Oregon Administrative Rule 836-150-0050 which states "(b) If the total reinsurance payments calculated under paragraph (a) of this rule would exceed the total dollar amount budgeted for the reinsurance program in a benefit year, the department may uniformly reduce the coinsurance rate for all reinsurance eligible issuers in that benefit year. If the department elects to reduce the coinsurance

rate under this paragraph, the department will reduce the coinsurance rate only to the extent necessary to ensure that reinsurance payments do not exceed the total dollar amount budgeted for the benefit year. " The coinsurance rate was adjusted to 48.1 percent, with the adjusted total matching the set budget of \$107,800,000.00. The total number of members who reached the set parameters for the 2021 program year amounted to 2,289.

#### **Medicaid Redetermination-Oregon**

The Oregon Department of Consumer and Business Services (DCBS) is working with the Oregon Health Authority (OHA), who is taking a lead role in creating alternative health insurance plans for members who may lose coverage with the cessation of the Covid-19 Public Health Emergency, which may cease during the 2023 program year:

- Issue Summary: OHA estimates as many as 300,000 Oregonians may lose coverage when Medicaid redetermination resume following the end of the federal COVID-19 public health emergency. Under House Bill 4035 (2022), DCBS has been working with OHA, the DHS, and a new task force to explore options to address this by establishing new coverage options.
- Current Status: The task force recommendation will most likely be a basic health plan option under the ACA, a Medicaid-like program for individuals between 138-200% of the federal poverty level. The recommendation may also include policy options to mitigate potential adverse impacts on the commercial insurance market, currently under development.
- Key Decision Points and Milestones: The Task Force established by HB 4035 has been meeting for months and will be reporting to the Legislature by the end of the year. The Legislature will likely need to approve aspects of the plan in the 2023 session.
