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EXTENSION OF LONG-TERM CARE INSURANCE ORDER

The director of the Department of Consumer and Business Services for the State of Oregon, acting under the authority in ORS 731.870, issued an order effective March 25, 2020, through April 23, 2020, directing all insurers transacting insurance in Oregon to extend deadlines for reporting claims, institute grace periods for premium payment, suspend cancellations and nonrenewal, and provide other specified relief to Oregon insureds. On April 23, 2020, the director extended the duration of the order to be in effect through May 23, 2020.

The director issued the Long-term Care Insurance Order to all insurers transacting long-term care insurance in Oregon, effective May 24, 2020, through June 22, 2020, that extended and modified the relief insurers are to provide to Oregon policyholders and terminated the March 25, 2020, order for long-term care insurers. On June 22, 2020, and again on July 22, 2020, the director extended the duration of the Long-Term Care Insurance Order to be in effect through Aug. 21, 2020.

The director has determined that the COVID-19 outbreak in Oregon, which resulted in a state of emergency, continues to substantially interfere with the public's ability to carry on its normal course of business. The director, therefore, extends the duration of the Long-Term Care Insurance Order to be in effect through Sept. 20, 2020.
