

EXTENSION OF HEALTH INSURANCE ORDER

The director of the Department of Consumer and Business Services for the State of Oregon, acting under the authority in ORS 731.870, issued a Health Insurance Order effective May 5, 2020 through June 3, 2020, directing all health insurers transacting insurance in Oregon, with the exception of accidental death and dismemberment, disability, and long term care coverage, to extend deadlines for reporting claims, institute grace periods for premium payment, suspend cancellations and nonrenewals, and provide other specified relief to Oregon policyholders.

The director extended the duration of this order for 30 days on June 3, 2020, again on July 2, 2020, and again on Aug. 2, 2020.

The director has determined that the COVID-19 outbreak in Oregon, which resulted in a state of emergency,¹ continues to substantially interfere with the public's ability to carry on its normal course of business. The director, therefore, extends the duration of the Health Insurance Order to be in force through Sept. 30, 2020.
