



ORDER EXTENDING WILDFIRE EMERGENCY ORDER

On July 31, 2026, the Director of the Oregon Department of Consumer and Business Services (“Director”), acting under the authority in ORS 731.870, issued a Wildfire Emergency Order (“Order”) that, among other things, made certain findings and conclusions and ordered all insurers to immediately (i) take certain enumerated actions for reporting of claims and other communications about claims with insureds having insurance policies issued, delivered, or covering a risk in any of the Affected Areas¹; (ii) institute a grace period for premium payment for all insurance policies issued, delivered, or covering a risk in the Affected Areas, ending no earlier than the first date on which the Order is no longer in effect; and (iii) take certain enumerated actions and adhere to certain enumerated directions with respect to cancellations and nonrenewals for all active insurance policies issued, delivered, or covering a risk in the Affected Areas. The Order had an effective period of 30 days from the date of the Order (subject to further extension by the Director under ORS 731.780(2)).

The Director has determined that the circumstances and conditions described in the Order still exist and that those circumstances and conditions warrant an extension of the effective period of the Order. Accordingly, pursuant to ORS 731.870(2), the Director hereby extends the effective period of the Order for a period of 30 days (subject to further extension under ORS 731.870(2)) from the date of this Order Extending Wildfire Emergency Order.
