What is the Oregon PDAB?

- The Oregon Prescription Drug Affordability Board was formed in 2022 to help protect Oregonians from the high costs of prescription drugs.
- The board holds monthly meetings that are open to the public, conducts annual prescription drug reviews, and makes recommendations to the Oregon Legislature.



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Who serves on PDAB?

- The board has eight members.
- Members are Oregon residents appointed by the governor and confirmed by the Senate, with backgrounds in clinical medicine or health care economics.
- These are volunteer positions and terms are 4 years.

PDAB annual report

- Each year the board identifies up to nine drugs and, optionally, insulin products, that may create affordability challenges for health care systems or high out-of-pocket costs for patients.
- The report also includes policy recommendations to make prescription drugs more affordable in Oregon.

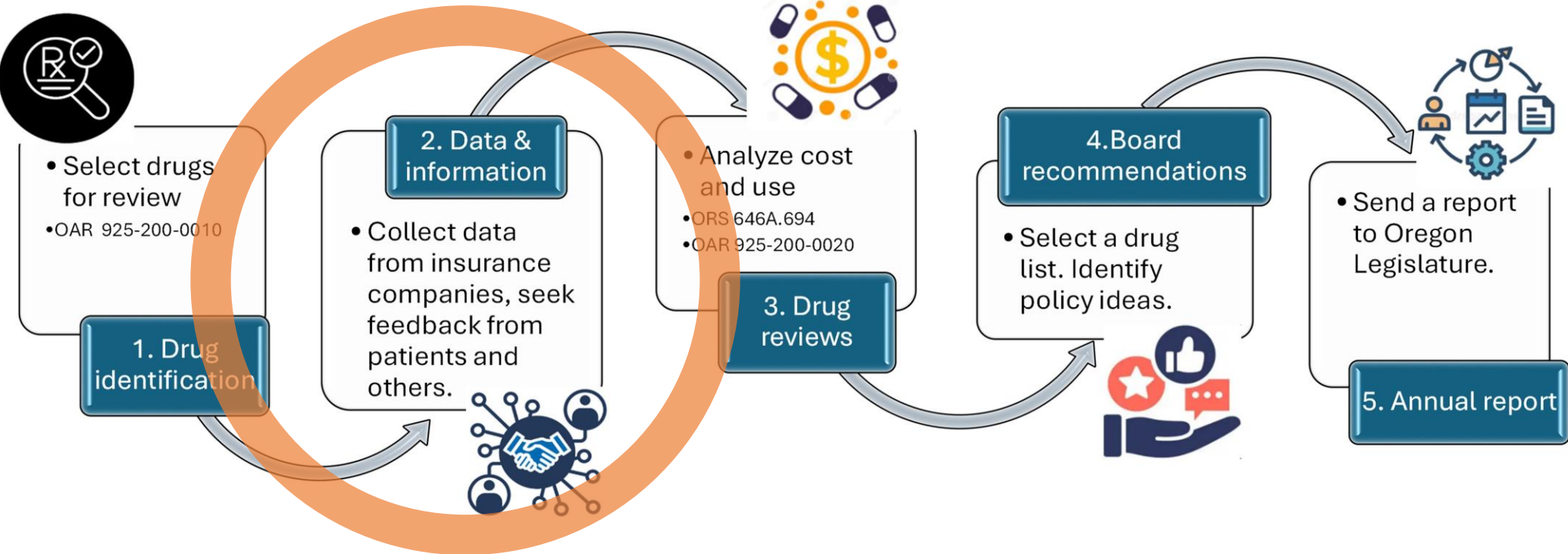

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2026 FEEDBACK FORMS

- **PATIENTS, CAREGIVERS, AND ADVOCACY**

For individuals who have been prescribed a medication on the review list, as well as their caregivers or family members. Advocacy groups representing patients or caregivers may also choose this form.

- **INDIVIDUALS WITH SCIENTIFIC OR MEDICAL TRAINING**

For medical providers, doctors, nurses, professors, researchers, pharmacists, representatives of medical clinics and hospitals, and others with a background and training in medicine or science.

- **SAFETY NET PROVIDERS**

For 340B clinics, federally qualified health centers serving Oregon communities, and coordinated care organizations serving Oregon Health Plan members.

- **MANUFACTURERS**

For companies that manufacture prescription drugs and trade associations representing manufacturers.

- **PHARMACY BENEFIT MANAGERS**

For pharmacy benefit managers – third-party administrators that manage prescription drug programs for health plans.

- **HEALTH PLAN INSURERS**

For companies that provide health insurance to Oregonians.
